Sediment removals from the Vedder River follow a well established process that directly involves First Nations representatives as participants in the Vedder River Management Area Committee (VRMAC). First Nations members of the committee are: People of the River Referrals , Ts'elxweyeqw Tribe (Aitchelitz; Skowkale; Shxwhá:y;Soowahile; Squiala; Tzeachten and Yakweakwoose First Nations). and Lower Fraser Fisheries Alliance. First Nations consultation for this project is currently being completed as part of Provincial Environmental Application submitted through Front Counter BC. The current consultation has been set up to provide a three cycle (six year) approval under the Provincial Water Act. First Nations (Sto:lo Tribal Council on behalf of Ts'elxweyeqw Tribe) participated in the formulating of the Vedder River Management Area Plan Update (Tetratch EBA, December 2015) Tis plan includes the flood protection program and its component sediment removal program.

DFO has historically been a member of VRMAC and used this participation to initiate its reviews under section 35 of the Fisheries Act. Recently, participation has included DFO staff from the Chilliwack Hatchery and from the Resource Restoration Unit who use this forum to identify projects that may conflict or benefit from sediment removal activities. For 2020, VRMAC is providing gravel for enhancement projects and will coordinate use of large wood debris (LWD) resources from the proposed sites.
